There was a reading last week from Isaiah 58. God was addressing the Jews on the subject of fasting. He described the type of fasting that is commonly seen among us even today. He went on to say, *"This, rather, is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; Setting free the oppressed, breaking every yoke; Sharing your bread with the hungry; Sheltering the oppressed and the homeless; Clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own."*

When you put your donation in the blue Santa Rosa Food Pantry envelopes you "share your bread with the hungry." When you put your donation into the St. Vincent de Paul envelopes you "shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked", provide electricity to warm their shelters and water to clean their bodies and clothing, fund transportation and assist with medical and dental payments. When you put your donation into the St. Vincent de Paul envelopes, you can be assured that 90% of your donation will go to fund the needs of our neighbors in need. The other 10% will be used by upper Councils as they need to accomplish their Mission of assisting Conferences in the Vincentian Charism and assisting the poor who come to their doors.
