In the first reading today, Chronicles reminds us of what happened to the Israelites when they ignored the prophets.

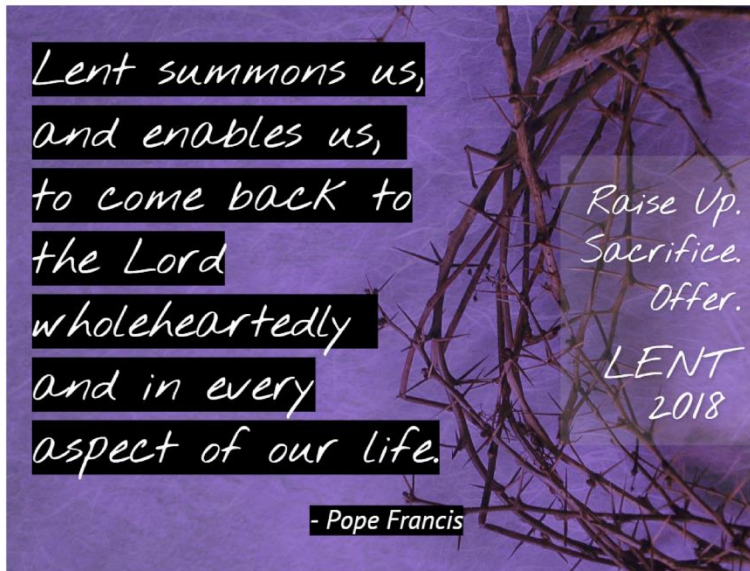
In the Gospel Jesus tells Nicodemus that God sent his son not to condemn the world, but to save it.

## Saint Vincent's Corner

While bitter cold weather days may be behind us, the electric bills are still coming in. Weather related high energy bills create a financial hardship on those who struggle to make ends meet. While their homes may be small, they are frequently poorly insulated and quite drafty. Many of the homes sit above the ground allowing the cold air to envelop the entire home. Because of your generous donations our Conference members can respond to calls and assist with electric bills on an as needed basis. With your donations to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul we can make a difference in the lives of those in need.

Every month Santa Rosa Vincentians visit approximately 84 senior individuals. We bring them food, check clogged air conditioning units, check propane levels, make minor repairs on the spot, discuss medical needs and other bills that crop up; but most especially, we listen to them and pray with them.

One of the recurrent needs that we try to assist with is adult diapers and bed pads. These are a big expense for people trying to live on social security. If you would like to help provide these basic needs for our family members, **we currently need female diapers size Large and X-Large, male diapers size Medium, and Large bed pads.** Any brand is appreciated. **You may place them on or near our peanut butter shelf in the back of church.**
