

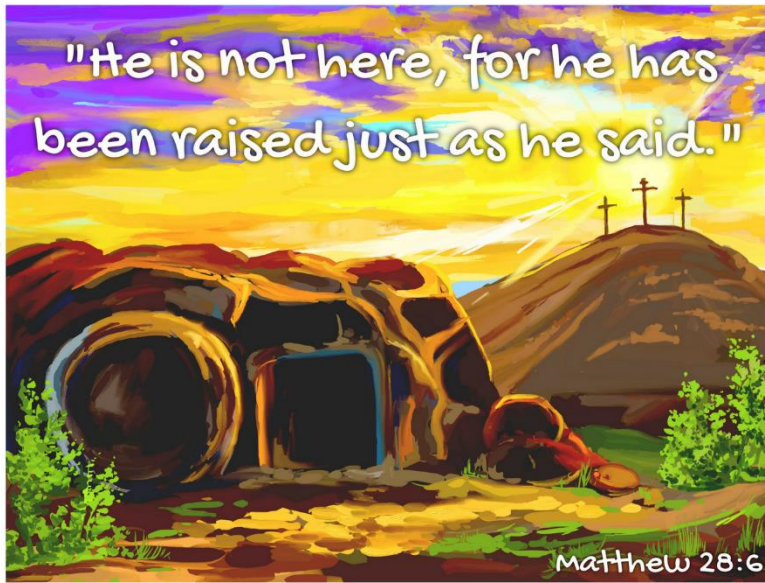
SANTA ROSA DE LIMA CATHOLIC CHURCH
